

VISIT OUR CLUBHOUSE!

I believe it was the year 1999, our Board of Directors decided it was time to find a way to build our own Clubhouse. They talked with the membership, and then talked a little more. The MID 10 Club was a Nashville based club from the beginning and they all agreed to look hard to find a place at home in Nashville. When they found the Wilson County Fairgrounds willing to allow them space in the Fiddlers Grove, it was up to the board members to first sell the idea to the membership and then find the money to build a building.

I think they first wanted to build a service station of sorts with antique gas pumps, but the ladies spoke up that is was a "Gas Station" ... folks would call it a "Filling Station". What if they build a Car Museum or a Car Club Lodge? The old boys knew they needed to think a little more about the project. How about a Car Garage with plenty of room for potluck dinners and bingo?

In 2000, the new Clubhouse had a ground breaking ceremony and work began on a 40 ft. x 60 ft. Garage with all the members assisting in the construction. Our member, Fred Farrer of Farrer Brothers Construction donated the labor while the membership donated the money. We then installed the new heat & air system to make it more comfortable.

The first meeting was held on a concrete slab with no walls. But soon the walls were up and the doors were in place. Like the "Little Rascals", they wanted everyone to have a password to get in. After more thought, the password would not work too well. We wanted anybody who truly enjoyed old cars to be welcome. We had club members donate antique car memorabilia to make it feel like home.

In 2004, we added restrooms and kitchen appliances. Then in 2007, we added a 20 ft. x 40 ft. addition to house our club trailer from the winter elements. This year we have added a new kitchen addition to our clubhouse. It is 15 ft x 30 ft and will give us additional room for one of our favorite pastimes, eating. We have also adopted Clay's Gas Station next door to the clubhouse. We are in the process of decorating it with period correct items.

So with a small annual membership donation in place, more new members joined the club. Today, we have a large listing of members that are available for any project be it large or small.

Our members are a very varied bunch. We have doctors, lawyers, business owners and many members from a wide variety of backgrounds. Our diversity is our strength and we welcome new members to come and get involved in the many activities in the new building with us.

History of FALL MEET ANTIQUE CAR SHOW

The Middle Tennessee Region Club was chartered in February of 1956 in Nashville, TN. The founding of our club was the result of a meeting between Don Anderson and Dan McGugin who had gotten together to talk about their old cars. The first officers of Mid-Tenn. were: Arnold Habert, Pres., Charles Todd, V.P., Mitch McGid, Sec. and Dan McGugin, Treas. For many years members met at the Purity Dairies plant in Nashville.

The club immediately organized a Fall Meet held on the public square in Murfreesboro. "Ring-Style" judging was used. The next year the show was held at Mammoth Cave, KY in cooperation with the Kyanna Region AACA. This arrangement lasted for five more years.

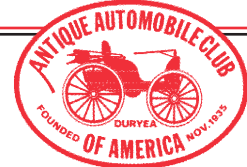
In September of 1962 the show moved to Red Boiling Springs, TN. The tradition of hosting the Fall Meet on the second Saturday of September was born! Historic Red Boiling Springs became the perfect location for old cars and old friends to gather.

Red Boiling Springs has been a tourist attraction since 1880 when James F.O. Shaughnessy bought two hundred acres including the boiling springs and forethought to build a great summer resort. In 1895 the town was advertised as the place to go to cure diseases by the great mineral springs. Red Boiling Springs became a boom town during the next 35 years with many hotels filling the charming valley. Donoho, Arlington, Moss, Colonial, Red Boiling Springs, Cloyd, Counts and the Palace were known far and wide. The town has become a tourist destination for those wanting to step back in time, relax and enjoy some of Tennessee's best country cooking.

For 48 years the Mid-TN Region AACA has called Red Boiling Springs home for its Fall Meet. Our show is held on the beautiful grounds of The Thomas House Hotel (formerly Cloyd's) and has become the premier Antique Car Show to attend in Tennessee. We are known for the large number of pre-war vehicles and our ever-growing flea market. Our 50th Anniversary Fall Meet had over 400 vehicles spread throughout the venue. 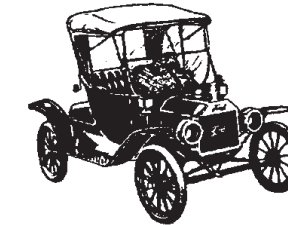
