Our club puts on and judges in more car shows than most clubs do. We have a good reputation in the classic car community, and we must continue our high quality of performance to preserve it.

In case you haven't heard, our club is hosting a National Meet. It is June 11,12,13. Plans are way along for this and we look forward to putting our best

foot forward. This will be the first national meet ever held in Lebanon. We are expecting at least 400 cars for this event. There will be over 200 judges here also. We can expect a large turnout for the flea market. The public is invited and we anticipate a very large attendance. We do need financial support for this meet. We are selling adds in the program. You do not have to have a perfect car to enter in this meet. For example we have a 1958 VW. It is a fairly nice original car, but has not been restored. It will be entered in the HPOF class. HPOF stands for Historic Preservation of Original Features and is for vehicles 35 years or older, still possessing significant features that represent the original car as delivered by the dealer.

The DPC (Driver Participation Class) is for vehicles with minor modifications 25 years or older that have not obtained a national first prize. Certification will be based on vehicle components that must have the same appearance as when the vehicle was manufactured. The body/engine/chassis/driveline components must be period correct per the original manufacturer. Exceptions could be halogen headlights, FM radio, seat belts, turn signals, and/or air conditioning units from the period. Originality of all components is more important than their condition.

If you have any questions about entering your vehicle, please contact any of us and if we do not know the answer we will find out for you.

We need you to help spread the word about this show. If you are involved with other clubs we have some tri-fold brochures for them. If you know someone who would like to have a flea market space, let them know. Flea market and car carrol spaces are only \$25.00. If you know someone who would like to volunteer to help work at the show and is not a member of the club, first invite them to be a member. Even if they don't want to join the club, we could use their help.
